



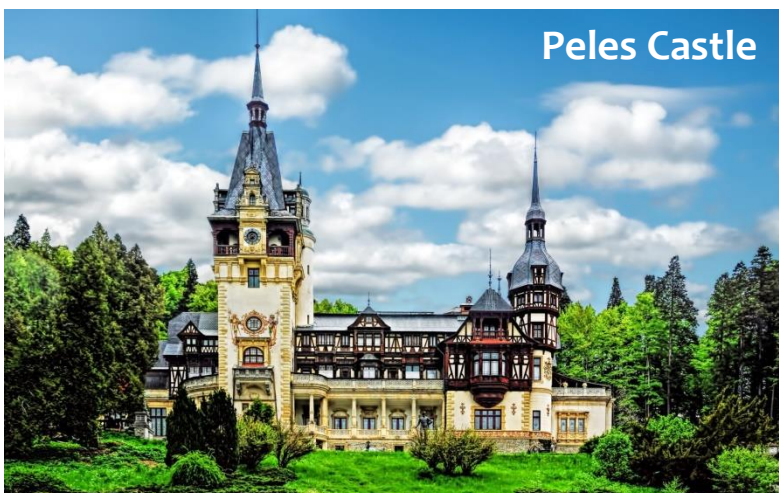
Romania's 2 Most Popular Transylvanian Castles in 1 Day



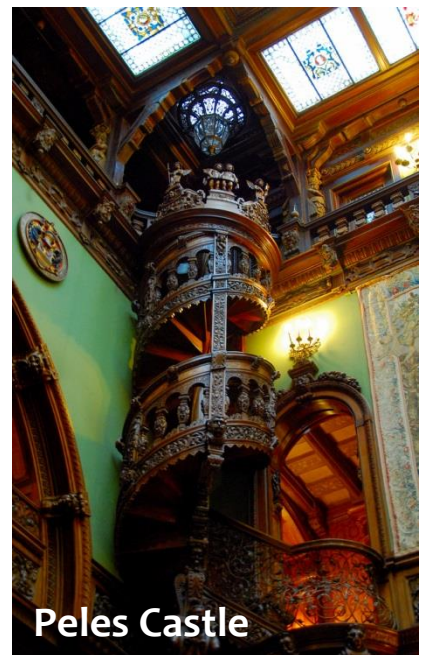
Our itinerary follows the road of Transylvania (road of Dracula).

Bran Castle

Where: Bran, Transylvania – Central Romania

Nearest large towns: Brasov, Predeal, Sinaia

Surrounded by an aura of enigma and legend and landed high atop a 200-foot-high rock, Bran Castle owes its popularity to its impressive towers and turrets as well as to the myth built around Bran Stoker's Dracula. Constructed on the place of a Teutonic Knights fortification dating from 1212, the castle was first certificated in an act originated by Louis I of Hungary on November 19, 1377.



Peles Castle

Where: Sinaia, Walachia – Southern Romania

Nearest large towns: Brasov and Bucharest

Nestled at the base of the Bucegi Mountains in the charming town of Sinaia, Peles Castle is a jewel of German new-Renaissance architecture, acknowledged by numerous one of the most remarkable castles in Europe. Commissioned by King Carol I in 1873 and finished in 1883, the castle served as the summer residence of the royal family until 1947. Its 160 rooms are decorated with the exceptional examples of European art, Murano crystal chandeliers, German stained-glass windows and Cordoba leather-covered walls.
